What is the D&L?

- The Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor was created by act of Congress, Nov. 18, 1988
- The D&L National Heritage Corridor is both a region and an idea
- Five counties in PA: Luzerne, Carbon, Lehigh, Northampton and Bucks
- Created to preserve and interpret the historic pathway from anthracite mine to market
- ...and to tell the nationally significant story of our region's role in US industry



The D&L Trail: the spine of the Corridor

- Longest multi-use trail in Pennsylvania
- Follows the historic transportation route of anthracite from mine to market
- Stretches from the anthracite coal regions in the north to the Delaware River tidewater at Bristol
- Incorporates canal towpath and former railroad rights-of-way



The National Canal Museum

- Founded in 1970 to preserve and present the history of Pennsylvania's canals
- Its mission and collections broadened to encompass anthracite, canals, railroads, and 19th and early 20th century industries of our region
- Spearheaded the creation of the D&L Corridor in 1988



Two Become One

- In 2017, the D&L and the National Canal Museum merged, and the Museum became one of the Corridor's signature programs.
- This combined the knowledge and collections of NCM with the financial resources and geographic scope of the Corridor.

- The D&L Trail is on the Delaware Canal's and Lehigh Navigation's towpaths from Bristol to Allentown, Weissport to Jim Thorpe.
- Spur trails follow the towpath in Walnutport,
 Parryville, and Hugh Moore Park


Rail Trail

- The D&L Trail is on vacated sections of the rights of way of the Lehigh Valley, Lehigh & Susquehanna, Lehigh and New England and Jersey Central Railroads.
- Rail Trails begin in Cementon and will reach to Wilkes-Barre when the Trail is fully connected.


165 : The Official D&L Trail Guide

- The Guide helps walkers, hikers, and cyclists plan routes, find access, food, and lodging






The climate-controlled archive holds:

- 18,000+ photographs
- 2000 books
- 2000+ glass lantern slides
- 900+ artifacts
- 1300+ postcards
- 5000 pamphlets
- Lehigh Coal & Navigation, Bethlehem Steel, Atlas and Alpha Portland Cement, Dixie Cup and other records, photos, and artifacts of Corridor industries
- Model boats, locks, and trains
- The Pennsylvania Canal Society Collection
- Etcetera.....



Hugh Moore Park: Our home base

The history of the Corridor is found in microcosm here



- The only fully restored and functional section of the Lehigh Navigation: dam, guard lock, feeder, waste gates, lift lock. Towpath from Dam 8 to Dam 9
- Ruins of Glendon Iron Works, the second anthracite iron furnace in the US
- Remains of America's first "industrial park" and an LCN hydroelectric plant
- Lehigh Valley Railroad line in active use by Norfolk Southern
