What amazing sights you must have witnessed!


Who will dance with the wind now that you are gone?

Now you will live on in another form, giving life to myriad organisms.








Champion trees along the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal (all in Maryland; 3 counties; county champions unless otherwise noted with asterisk as state champion also [\*] – largest of its kind in the entire state):

Eastern cottonwood - N39.647010 W78.762660 (near Cumberland Visitors Center canal boat replica) White oak - N39.599152 W78.756886 (next to a bench along the towpath)

Sycamore - N39.565901 W78.723801 (approximately 60 feet from towpath towards the Potomac River) Black walnut - N39.530722 W78.465421 (approximately 1.5 miles upstream from Paw Paw Tunnel)
