






North-South Massachusetts Canal



North-South Delaware & Raritan Canal




North-South Chesapeake & Delaware Canal






North-South Great Dismal Swamp Canal




Pennsylvania Main Line Canal






James River & Kanawha Canal






Charleston or Savannah to Tennessee River Canal















ALBERT GALLATIN

son of JNO.DE GALLATIN, and of SOPHIA ALBERTINA ROLAZ DUROSEY his wife he was born at GEVEVA in EUROPE 29 Jan landed in AMERICA 14# July 1780; died at ASTORIA NEW YORK 12#August 1849.

Deeply imbued with the bold, and liberal spirit of the times, he came to AMERICA, a midst the scenes of her REAL and after very many years of public service in Congress, and in Executive offices of the highest trust, at an adva he withdrew to private life, and passed the remainder of his days in philosophic studies, and literary pursuits and went down to the grave universally honored.
